“HATS ON!” AT HOLY ROSARY FROM SEPTEMBER 1

At Holy Rosary, our SunSmart Policy notes that all children will be required to wear school broad brimmed hats from ‘Hats On Day’- September 1 to ‘Hats Off Day’ - May 1, whenever they are outside including sports lessons. However, if the UV is 3 or above it is recommended hats be worn for protection. Children without hats will be required to remain under cover near the Grade 1 rooms. – ‘NO HAT, NO PLAY’ policy will be enforced.

Sophie discovered the caterpillars in her backyard, researched and studied the caterpillars and wrote the report below. Sophie was able to research and correctly identify the caterpillars from their characteristics. A marvellous example of remote learning, well done Sophie!

ANESTIA OMBROPHANES OR CLOUDED FOOTMAN

INTRODUCTION

These caterpillars are known scientifically as the Anestia Ombrophanes and the Clouded Footman in simple terms. They grow to about 2 cm in length.

APPEARANCE

These caterpillars are black and have a pale yellow pattern on the back of each section, including two thin pale yellow lines running along the back. These caterpillars have a row of orange spots along each side and have long fine hairs which project to the front, rear and sideways.

DIET

These caterpillars feed on plants such as: Lichen (*Cup Lichen*),
Green Algae (*Bracteacoccus species*) and
Black Algae (*Gloeocapsa magma*).

COCOONS

These caterpillars form a pupa inside a cocoon made of silk and larval hairs. They attach their cocoons to a fence, tree or wall. The male and female pupae have different colour patterns. The pupae of both genders is white with scattered black markings. Furthermore the male has a row of orange spots along each side. The female pupa is also white with scattered black markings but in difference with the male, female has a row of pink spots along each side, and also a pink band.

ADULT

The adult male has black and white forewings and plain pale yellow hindwings. The male moths have a wingspan of about 2 cms. Underneath the male moth is yellow with black areas at the tips of each. The adult female has a length of about 1 cm. Females are wingless and flightless and they have a large grey body with pink spots. The female stays near her cocoon, and the male breeds with her there.

HABITAT

The species may be found over much of the southern half of Australia, including: Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia.

EGGS

The eggs are smooth, white and oval. With a diameter of about 1/2 mm. They are laid typically by a female in an irregular cluster of 20 to 40, on the cocoon from which she emerged.
