## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to the 2022 school year, it certainly has been a beginning preceded with much anticipation. It was great to see the children's smiling faces coming through the gate, ready to reunite with friends, make new friendships and learn at school. We have welcomed 42 Foundation children who have joined our Holy Rosary community and we look forward to sharing the journey of primary school with them and their families.

In addition, we have also welcomed new staff to our school and again we look forward to welcoming them and working together.

I have sent through the most recent and up to date COVID information as it has come to hand and today we have sent home the 'RAT' kits with all children on site and as per Government requests we ask that parents use 2 tests per week to support a safer school environment. As per our instructions only positive 'tests' need to be reported to the school and the Department of Health, and then the subsequent isolation will be required.

COVID vaccination for students is not mandatory to attend school, but it is highly encouraged to keep all staff, children and their families safe. All children aged 5 and above are now eligible for a COVID-19 vaccination.

Masks will be mandatory for students in grade three and above when indoors, and for staff other than when they are communicating or teaching from the front of a classroom, where a mask may impede their ability to teach. Mask wearing is "recommended" for students in grade prep to two. We have limited supply at school and request families ensure they have sent a mask along to school with their children.

Most importantly, children with any Covid-19 symptoms should be tested for Covid-19 and kept at home, even if they test negative on a rapid antigen test, until their symptoms subside. If your child becomes sick while at school, they will be sent straight to the sickbay and you will be called to come and pick them up.

The Marong Cup will be held on Saturday 19th February. We look forward to being able to once again be a part of this fundraiser for all catholic Schools in Bendigo. If you are available we will need volunteers, and will provide more information in the coming days.

Finally, if you need to discuss an issue or concern please contact your child's classroom teacher and an appointment may be made, particularly now as parents are unable to be in the classroom.

We look forward to an exciting year ahead and providing the best possible environment for learning and building our great community.

#### **SCHOOL DROP OFF & PICKUP**

- Children in the playground are supervised from 8:30 a.m. Gates and classrooms will remained locked until this time.
   Children should not arrive at school before this time.
- If you are dropping off or collecting from the opposite side of Napoleon Cres, please get out of the car and cross the road with your children or direct them to use the children's crossing.
- There are No Parking signs in the bays at the front of the school office in Napoleon Crescent. No parking signs allow vehicles to stop in the marked bays and pick up passengers. The driver must remain within 2 metres of the vehicle and the vehicle must leave the bay within 2 minutes of stopping. These requirements only apply within the times displayed on the signs.
- The tennis courts will be available for drive through drop-off and pick up of children before and after school. Entry is from Hamelin St and exit is onto Napoleon Cres. Please do not park on the courts.
- If your child/ren need to leave early, please call the school office on arrival. A staff member will bring your child to the gate to meet you.
- If your child/ren arrive late, please ensure they report directly to the school office to be signed in and receive a late pass.

#### End of Day:

- Students waiting at the gates (Foundation/Gr 1 gate, playground gate or drive through) between 3:15pm and 3:30pm will be supervised by a yard duty teacher.
- At 3:30pm the duty teacher will then bring all uncollected children to the office to await their parents.
- Students catching the bus home will leave their classrooms at the 3.10pm bus bell and assemble beside the sand pit, they will then be escorted up to the bus stop outside of Ted's Shed. Please ensure that your child knows if they are to catch the bus and that they need to go directly to bus line when the bus bell rings.



#### **CYBER SAFETY**

Cyber Safety becomes more important every day. Recently there have been some changes to the Cyber Safety Laws in Australia. Please see an excerpt from the fact sheet provided by the E Safety Commissioner.

#### What is the Online Safety Act 2021?

The Online Safety Act 2021 is new legislation that makes Australia's existing laws for online safety more expansive and much stronger.

Our laws need to keep pace with advances in technology and the threats we face online from harmful behaviour and toxic content. These modern times of rapid change and social upheaval call for robust new laws.

The new powers in the Online Safety Act cement eSafety's role as a world leader in online safety. They place Australia at the international forefront in the fight against online harm.

## What does the Online Safety Act 2021 mean for Australians?

The Act has significant implications for online service providers because it makes them more accountable for the online safety of the people who use their service.

The Act gives eSafety substantial new powers to protect all Australians – adults now as well as children – across most online platforms and forums where people can experience harm.

There is, for the first time, a clear set of expectations for online service providers that makes them accountable for the safety of people who use their services.

The Act also requires industry to develop new codes to regulate illegal and restricted content. This refers to the most seriously harmful material, such as videos showing sexual abuse of children or acts of terrorism, through to content that is inappropriate for children, such as high impact violence and nudity.

## What are the main changes in the new Act?

The Online Safety Act:

- creates a world-first Adult Cyber Abuse
   Scheme for Australians 18 years and older
- broadens the Cyberbullying Scheme for children to capture harms that occur on services other than social media
- updates the Image-Based Abuse Scheme that allows eSafety to seek removal of intimate images or videos shared online without the consent of the person shown
- gives eSafety new powers to require internet service providers to block access to material showing abhorrent violent conduct such as terrorist acts
- gives the existing Online Content Scheme new powers to regulate illegal and restricted content no matter where it's hosted
- brings app distribution services and search engines into the remit of the new Online Content Scheme
- introduces Basic Online Safety Expectations for online service providers
- halves the time that online service providers have to respond to an eSafety removal notice, though eSafety can extend the new 24 hour period.

#### **CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE PROGRAM (CAP) 2022**

The Conveyance Allowance is a form of financial assistance from the Victorian State Government to assist families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school. The allowance is available to parents who are required to –

- drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to school (if there is no school bus)
- or drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to meet the nearest school bus to the school
- the child must attend their closest government or non-government school (Catholic)
- the allowance is based on kilometres travelled and not based on any financial eligibility

Distance is calculated by the shortest practical route from home to the school or from home to meet the nearest school bus to the school. Distance can be calculated by using Bing Maps. Application and Authority to Pay Forms required to be completed by a parent are available from the school office.

Parents who received the Conveyance Allowance in 2021 do not need to complete a new form in 2022 unless their children enrolled at Holy Rosary in 2022 have changed (i.e. Gr 6 student left at the end of 2021 or a Foundation child commenced in 2022). If your family circumstances have changed, a new form needs to be completed in 2022.

If you have recently changed address please advise the office if you are no longer eligible. Application and Authority to Pay forms need to be completed and returned to the office by Friday 11 March 2022 please.


