

PROJECT COMPASSION 2023: SECOND WEEK OF LENT

Tereesa's Story: This week through Project Compassion we learn about Tereesa, a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. Once Tereesa became pregnant with her first child at the age of 16, she left school. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Through Baabayn, Tereesa was also able to hear stories from Indigenous Elders and reconnect with her culture.

Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community. Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:


- being sick, or having an infectious disease

- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)


Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal.
