Finally, thank you to Mr Conor Van Der Staay, who has taken on the role of Indigenous Coordinator. He is also working hard to support our school as we make changes to comply with Child Safe Regulation regarding the embedding of Indigenous perspectives and expectations within our school community.

Unfortunately, due to unforeseen circumstances our new social worker, Myf Truscott will not be able to join us this week as originally planned. However, we look forward to welcoming Myf at the beginning of Term 3.

The 2024 acceptance of enrolment offers is well under way and we will begin scheduling foundation interviews early Term 3, once Paul has returned from his study tour in Chicago.

We have noticed an increase in some unsafe behaviours while using the Napoleon Crescent school access point during school drop off and pick up times. As such I would like to encourage families who are not intending on entering the school grounds (therefore not necessarily requiring a parking spot) to embrace other points of access. The school drive thru encourages our children to keep road safety rules in mind. It also reinforces safety messages and safe passenger behaviours for both parents and children. In addition, this drop off and pick up system also teach the children cooperation and patience as they wait their turn and are called by an adult. Knowing and following the schools drop off and pick up practices will help make it safer for everyone. When using the drive thru please respect the following:

- Driver to remain behind the wheel in control of the vehicle at all times
- Requests to complete a drive thru loop if child is not in the waiting zone
- No stopping or pulling over underneath the COLA
- Slow Entry and Exit speed

Hopefully, you are all well rested after the long weekend break and you have enough fuel in the tank to see you through to the end of term. Having said that, please be kind to each other and remember that this is a very tiring time for many of our children.


