# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The weekend was certainly filled with some interesting developments surrounding the Coronavirus pandemic. Closing schools at this stage is a possibility and I personally believe, inevitable. As such we have cancelled the Learning Conversations. We will continue to be guided by the appropriate authorities and work through the coming weeks. In the meantime please be aware of promoting positive hygiene and reassure children, who at this time may feel some apprehension.

In Sunday's Gospel, the Third Sunday of Lent, Jesus approached a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well and asked her for a drink of water. This surprised the woman for several reasons. In the first place, it was unlikely that a man would ask a woman for anything and even more unbelievable that Jesus, a Jew, would ask something of a Samaritan, a great enemy of the Jewish people. Jesus explained to her that our thirst would return if we drank water from the well; but if we drank the water Jesus offered us, we would never thirst again. After Jesus told her many things about herself, she came to believe that he was the Son of God and called others to him. Jesus offers us living water just as he did the woman at the well. It is the water of salvation so when we stumble, we know that Jesus refreshes us with forgiveness. This is helpful to remember on days when we are disappointed by our anger, impatience, and discouragement.

# Respectful Relationships Education

Respectful Relationships education focuses on building and promoting gender equity in relationships and challenging of gender stereotypes. Respectful Relationships education is about tackling family violence.

It is about embedding respectful relationships education in school settings as evidence shows us attitudes about gender roles and expectations and stereotypes is a key driver of family violence and through education, positive change can occur.

## **Royal Commission into Family Violence**

The importance of teaching Respectful Relationships education was highlighted in the evidence and findings of the Royal Commission into Family Violence. Recommendation 189 stated that the Victorian Government mandate that Respectful Relationships education in Victorian schools. The Victorian Government accepted all recommendations of the Royal Commission.

## Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR)

## **TOPIC 7: GENDER AND IDENTITY**

Learning activities within this topic assist students to challenge stereotypes and critique the influence of gender norms on attitudes and behaviour. They learn about key issues relating to human rights and gender identity, and focus on the importance of respect within relationships. The activities promote respect for diversity and difference

### **TOPIC 8: POSITIVE GENDER RELATIONS**

Learning activities within this topic focus on building an understanding of the effects of gender-based violence and focus on the standards associated with respectful relationships. Students develop the skills needed to solve problems, set boundaries within relationships, and play an active role within the prevention of gender-based violence. They develop peer support and help-seeking skills that can be applied in response to situations involving gender-based violence in family, peer, community or on-line relationships.

## 2020 is the year for 95% attendance at Holy Rosary

This year you will notice a continued focus on student attendance at Holy Rosary. Student attendance is not only important for learning, it is essential to help create good habits for students in the future. High attendance in the primary years at school also helps to avoid potential school refusal and mental health issues during adolescent years.




