## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The issue of safety around schools was heightened last week with a number of incidents at neighbouring schools. It is important that as adults we model appropriate behaviour including following road rules as we 'drop off' and 'pick up' our children. The tennis courts are now a drive through morning and afternoon and from our first experience this morning it worked well, with children able to safely move from car to school. The Council and Victoria Police will be monitoring parking around the school and I urge parents to be patient and considerate of others. Please do not park on the nature strip near the church, it is a pedestrian area and a near miss last Friday could have been so much worse. Again, we ask parents to be patient in these busy periods of the school day.

#### PARENTS AND FRIENDS MEETING

We will have our first P&F meeting this Wednesday 3rd March at 6.30pm in the Rosarium. The meeting will be a general meeting to assess where we are with a variety of fundraisers and social events we hold on an annual basis. We will also plan for the rest of 2021 following the disruptions of 2020. Our school has always had an incredibly successful Parents group and we look forward to welcoming new and existing families to our group.

#### SCHOOL BOARD/COUNCIL

Our next Board/Council Meeting will be held in the Rosarium on March 9th at 6.30pm. We will have Joan Coldwell speaking to the group regarding the changes to Governance.

#### **SWIMMING**

Our swimming program kicks off for Grade 3-6 children tomorrow and we look forward to children participating in the program over the next 4 days. Our recent swimming sports indicated a growing enthusiasm and the opportunity to learn about and practice water safety is an important part of our children's education. Once again, I ask that families participate in swimming outside of school and not rely solely on our program for this important life skill.

#### **GOSPEL**

In the Gospel reading on Sunday (Mark 9: 2-10), Jesus goes up a mountain with his disciples to pray. And then, while they were high up on the mountain, Jesus lit up. The scripture says that Jesus' "clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them." There is a special name for this scripture, it is called the Transfiguration. "Transfiguration" is a fancy word that means "to be changed."

Not only does Jesus shine with God's light and love, but he also shares God's light and love with the people who are around him. Jesus can help other people, like his disciples, learn how to shine with God's light and love. Then they can go out and help even more people shine with God's light and love.

The same is true for us. As we learn from Jesus and his disciples how to ask for and invite God's light and love into our lives, then we too, can share God's light and love with the people around us.

#### **SECOND WEEK OF LENT**

This week through Project Compassion we learn about 39-year-old Margret, a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands. She was born deaf, so she knows the challenges it poses to education and employment. Apart from the difficulties the students all have, the school also faced water shortages, with not enough to supply staff and students with safe water for drinking, cooking, washing and growing vegetables.

Then Tropical Cyclone Harold damaged the school and its vegetable garden, amidst the threat of COVID-19. Staff and students rely on the vegetable garden to provide food for their meals.

With Caritas Australia's support, the school installed water tanks, provided cyclone-proof building materials and helped to implement COVID-19 prevention measures. Margret's school now has enough water for its students and the capacity to cater for more, with plans to boost food security, through increased agricultural production.

Around 60% of people in rural areas in the Solomon Islands don't have access to piped water, while about 80% don't have access to latrines or toilets. (UNICEF, 2019)

#### **SWIMMING LESSONS (GR 3-6)**

The Year 3-6 children will have their swimming lessons **THIS WEEK**, from Tuesday 2nd - Friday 5th of March (4 days). This will be at Gurri Wanyarra in Kangaroo Flat. Permission forms have been released via PAM.

WHAT TO WEAR AND WHAT TO BRING: Sports uniform to school, bathers, towel, hairbrush, thongs to wear to the pool (these are not allowed in the school playground), plastic bag to put wet bathers in, goggles if your child

usually wears them. The children wear their bathers to the pool and get changed at the pool after their lesson.

**WHAT THEY WILL DO:** At the swimming lessons students will participate in 4 X 45 minute swimming sessions. Children will be swimming in ability levels supervised by qualified AustSwim Teachers from the Gurri Wanyarra Wellbeing Centre.

**THE AIMS OF THESE LESSONS:** To learn about water safety and improve swimming stroke technique.

## Wellbeing

#### **CYBERSAFETY**

Last week I included information on the impact of screen time on children's education as well as social, emotional and physical wellbeing. With increased access to, and use of technology for education and social purposes, the issue of cybersafety is something we all need to be more aware of. In the 1990's there was often only one online device in the family home – the desktop computer with dial-up internet! By 2015 each Australian household averaged 9 devices and in 2021 there is an average of 17 connected devices per person including smart TV's, laptops, iPads, tablets, phones, home services such as Google Home and smart watches (<a href="www.digitalhealth.gov.au">www.digitalhealth.gov.au</a>). Now, using the internet for employment, education and socialising provides us an opportunity to build skills and stay connected with others. Positive social support, albeit remotely, can improve our capacity to cope with stress and isolation. But how can we ensure that we are connecting with friends and family in a safe way? There are various online games, apps and chat rooms available, all offering fun and easy ways to stay connected. However, the reality is that online threats are very real, and in the current environment even more so, as more of us, including our children, utilise the internet to connect with others daily.

Parents can follow some simple steps, including understanding the various internet security settings, only having technology used in open spaces within the family home, setting time limits, and discussing internet safety with their children.

Some more useful tips for parents to manage their child's time on devices and make it safe include:

- talk to your child about staying safe on the internet
- monitor children's time online, particularly younger children
- set house rules what's okay to do and what's not, how much time is 'online' time and what kind of personal information is okay to share and make public
- consider using filters or other technological tools to help limit exposure to potentially harmful or distressing material
- find out what children are up to, create your own accounts and play with the services they are using so that you become familiar with them
- model the kind of positive online behaviour you would like them to use.

#### **PARKING**

Parking Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community.

"The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.

Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a Uturn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones. City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules."

#### **CANTEEN 2021**

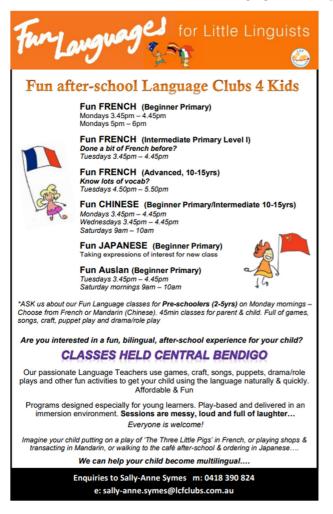
