PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This Wednesday 2nd March is Ash Wednesday, the first day of the Christian season of Lent. The marking of the Ashes on Ash Wednesday is an expression of our faith and a sign that we are asking God for forgiveness. It is a time of prayer, fasting and giving to others. Through prayer we come closer to God so that we are better able to realise our baptismal promise to live justly as Jesus teaches us. Fasting joins us in solidarity with the poor who often have no choice but to go without basic needs such as food, water and shelter. Giving to the poor or 'almsgiving' is a sign of our commitment to justice and our thanks for all that God has given us.

Lent prepares us for the season of Easter, the most important time in the Church's calendar. By praying, fasting and giving alms, we are reminded of Jesus' death and Resurrection. Jesus brought the promise of hope to all people so that we may "Have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10), so that with our neighbours, we can go further, together.

Shrove Tuesday will precede the day, with children enjoying pancakes as we traditionally prepare for the Lenten season. On Wednesday, look forward to sharing a liturgy with the children to celebrate the day on the grass area.

God our Father,

as we begin this holy season of Lent,

help us to see that your merciful love is with us always,

even when we wander far from you.

With the help of your grace,

may our prayers and sacrifices over the next forty days lead us closer to you and to each other,

the poor, the sick and the lonely so that together, we can fulfil your promises for all who live in your love. Amen. Congratulations and thanks to the children and staff involved in the successful Catholic Swimming Sports today. It was great to hear that we had some early success and were representing the school so well. We will have more information next week regarding our results.



As the restrictions continue to be wound back in our community we are reminded that masks are mandated for all staff and for children in Grade 3-6. 
I urge families to be vigilant and children who are symptomatic should remain at home. If you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to call or email me for clarification.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE - CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) is a Victorian Government program that assists eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. Any parents/carers who hold a valid means-tested concession card, a Gold DVA card or are a temporary foster parent, may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards these items.

The CSEF form is available on the **Beginning of Year google site**.

If you did not receive a CSEF payment in 2021, have had a new child start, or are a new family, please fill in and return the application form to the office as soon as possible. If you are unsure whether you are eligible, whether you need to reapply etc, please see Paula in the office.

CYBER SAFETY: PARENTAL CONTROLS

As a parent, you'll likely want to allow your children to use technology for communications, learning and more. You're also going to want to be sure that your children use the internet safely and securely. Parental controls are a great way to be proactive about your child's online safety and activities.

OnGuardOnline.gov gives a breakdown of different types of parental controls:

Filtering and blocking limits access to specific websites, words or images.

Blocking outgoing content prevents your children from sharing personal information online and via email.

Limiting time allows parents to set time limits for how long their children are online and the time of day they can access the internet.

Monitoring tools alert parents to their children's online activity without blocking access and can be used with or without the child's knowledge. Some software can record which websites a child has visited. Other programs display warning messages when children visit certain websites.

11:00am – 12:00pm (1 volunteer) 1:30pm – 2:30pm (2 volunteers)




NetSetGO is for Girls and Boys in Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 to start learning how to play Netball - with fun games and basic drills!
